INTERNATIONAL DIALOGUE BERLIN 2004

DaimlerChrysler AG and the United Nations Association of Germany – Berlin-Brandenburg Branch in cooperation with the Humboldt Institution for Transatlantic Issues (HITI) invite advanced international students and young graduates to take part in the fifth International Dialogue Berlin on the topic of "Visions of New Transatlantic Relations". The conference will take place on July 8th and 9th, 2004.

Transatlantic relations have been under considerable stress recently due to diverse positions of American and European Nations in matters

pertaining to economy, the role and influence of the United Nations, terrorism, security, and the war against Iraq.

Current developments like the enlargement of the European Union, the European Defence Initiative, and efforts to build a European Constitution will initiate further changes in Transatlantic Relations. National governments and international organizations face the challenge to adapt to these changes and to develop new forms of cooperation while at the same time maintaining their grown relationships.

“Visions of New Transatlantic Relations.”

The conference takes place in Berlin on **July 8th - July 9th, 2004**

The conference series International Dialogue Berlin (IDB) is a contribution by DaimlerChrysler AG and the United Nations Association of Germany to the Global Compact initiated by UN Secretary General Kofi Annan in 2000. Cooperation with the Humboldt Institution for Transatlantic Issues adds a highly qualified input to the field of Transatlantic Relations.

IDB offers a platform for exchange and cooperation to advanced international students and young graduates. IDB wants to establish an understanding for the responsible use of resources and power and to encourage network-building among emerging international elites.

Following a keynote-speech and a panel discussion, participants will meet in four workshops and discuss political, economic, legal, and cultural aspects of the general topic in depth.

Advanced international students and young graduates are eligible to participate in the conference. Applicants must have reached their 4th year of studies and must be under 30 years of age. The conference language is English.
