



INTERNATIONAL DIALOGUE BERLIN 2005

DaimlerChrysler AG and the United Nations Association of Germany – Berlin-Brandenburg invite advanced international students and young graduates to take part in the sixth International Dialogue Berlin on the topic of “A Shared Responsibility: New American Leadership and the United Nations”. The conference will take place on November 15th, 2005.

Debates on UN reform are nearly as old as the Organization itself. The UN has had to adapt to new topics, actors, and a whole new world order. The decisions and priorities of the United States, as the most powerful member state, very much

affect the discussions, plans, and the chances for realization of UN reforms. IDB 2005 will focus on the relationship between the UN and the “only remaining superpower” and on the UN’s role in central fields of international politics such as Energy and the Environment.

The conference series International Dialogue Berlin (IDB) is a contribution by DaimlerChrysler AG and the United Nations Association of Germany to the Global Compact initiated by UN Secretary General Kofi Annan in 2000.

“A Shared Responsibility: New American Leadership and the United Nations”

The conference takes place in Berlin on November 15th, 2005

IDB offers a platform for exchange and cooperation to advanced international students and young graduates. IDB wants to establish an understanding for the responsible use of resources and power and to encourage network-building among emerging international elites.

Following a keynote-speech by Reinhard Bütikofer, Chairman of the Party Bündnis90/DIE GRÜNEN, and a panel discussion, participants and guests will meet in three individually moderated platforms to discuss in depth on:

- Reform of the UN: Collective Security and Institutional Design
- American UN Policy in the Second Term of Office of President George W. Bush
- New International Approaches to Energy and Environmental Policy.

Advanced international students and young graduates can participate in the conference. Applicants must have reached their 4th year of studies and must be under 30 years of age. The conference language is English.
